The formaldehyde briefing has been set for the 29th of July. So I will be making my case for putting restrictions on formaldehyde, based on the safety assessment and the fact that we need to respond to the CP. I have held the CP hostage until I can extract a decision by the agency, on the safety of formaldehyde. It looks like the time for that is approaching. The last briefing I had with Mayne a few weeks ago, resulted in the brouhaha on WEN, so maybe formaldehyde has a similar path ahead of it. after that it will be tattoos, and then Talc. Today I heard that the commissioner is asking questions about spray tanners (DHA) and their carcinogenicity, and the retinyl palmitate study has been completed, and I am reviewing the manuscript which will raise questions. not considering parabens, MIT, allergens and phthalates, there is a lot of crap still left to deal with.
